AN ORDINANCE to amend the Education Ordinance,  
Ch. 14. No. 1.

**E**NACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Education (Amendment) Ordinance, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Education Ordinance, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the word "association" which appears in the definition of "manager" and by substituting therefor the word "body".

3. Section 13 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

- (i) by deleting the word "association" which appears therein and by substituting therefor the word "body";
- (ii) by deleting the word "churches" which appears therein and by substituting therefor the words "religious communities".

4. Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting in subsection (3) thereof—

- (i) the words "or recognised religious expert" immediately after the word "religion" which appears in the third line thereof and also immediately after the word "Minister" which appears in the sixth line thereof;
- (ii) the words "or body" immediately after the word "denomination" which appears in the fifth line thereof.

5. Section 18 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by—

- (a) repealing subsection (1) thereof and replacing it by the following subsection :—

"(1) Assisted schools shall be under the direction of Boards of management to be appointed by the Head or Governing Body of a religious denomination or body." ;

- (b) deleting the words "or in the case of East Indian schools the association" which appear in subsection (3) thereof and substituting therefor the words "or body" ;
- (c) deleting the words "or association" which appear in subsection (4) thereof.

6. Subsection (5) of section 23 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and replaced by the following subsection :—

“(5) Subject to the conditions hereunder prescribed, scholarships shall be of such amount as the Governor in Council may in each case decide, which amount shall be payable out of public funds in such instalments and on such dates as the Governor may from time to time determine :—

- (a) Each scholar to whom a scholarship is awarded shall be paid a maintenance allowance, of such amount as the Governor in Council may decide, per annum for a period of four years or for such shorter period as he may hold the scholarship and to an outfit allowance and an allowance for medical expenses not exceeding such amounts as the Governor in Council may decide: Provided that the Governor in Council may, on being satisfied that further financial assistance is required after the expiration of four years to enable the scholar to complete his course of study and that such scholar is making reasonable and satisfactory progress in his studies, authorise the payment of the aforesaid maintenance allowance from year to year for a further period.
- (b) All matriculation fees, registration fees, ordinary tuition and examination fees and other fees certified by the Director of Colonial Scholars as being necessary for the approved course of study, shall be paid on behalf of the scholar.
- (c) A passage allowance, of such amount as the Governor in Council may decide, in respect of the passage from the Colony to the place of study shall be paid to each student to whom a scholarship has been awarded and in the event of a scholar returning to the Colony within a year of the completion of his studies a further sum, of such amount as the Governor in Council may decide, shall be paid in respect of the passage back to the Colony: Provided that the Governor in Council may extend the time of such payment to two years after the completion of a scholar's studies for the purpose of enabling the scholar to obtain further qualifications or experience in his profession or course of study.

7. Section 25 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by deleting the word "association" which appears therein and by substituting therefor the word "body".
