REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 84 (11) OF THE
EDUCATION ACT, 1966

THE EDUCATION (TEACHING SERVICE) (AMENDMENT)
REGULATIONS, 1968

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Education (Teaching Service) Citation (Amendment) Regulations, 1968.

2. The Education (Teaching Service) Regulations, 1967, are hereby amended by—

(a) substituting for regulation 46 (1) thereof, the following—

“ 46. (1) Subject to paragraphs (1) (a) and (1) (b), sick leave may be granted by the Minister to a teacher for a period not exceeding fourteen days annually. An application for sick leave shall be supported by a medical certificate signed by a registered medical practitioner.

(1) (a) Where the period of absence from duty on account of illness does not exceed two days, a teacher shall not normally be required to tender a medical certificate.

(1) (b) Where a teacher habitually avails himself of the concession provided for in paragraph (1) (a), the Permanent Secretary may require that teacher to submit to a medical examination by a government medical officer.”; and

(b) inserting immediately after regulation 48 the following—

“Leave without pay in exceptional circumstances

48A. (1) In exceptional circumstances leave without pay for a period not exceeding one year may be granted to teachers by the Minister who may revoke such leave on discovery that it is being used for some purpose other than that for which it was granted.

(2) Leave granted under this regulation shall not constitute a break in service nor in any way prejudice pension entitlement.”.
