

LEGAL NOTICE NO. 122

REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8(1) of the Constitution of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago that the President may from time to time make a Proclamation declaring that a state of public emergency exists:

And whereas the President has by Proclamation made on the 3rd day of August, 1995, declared that a state of emergency exists in the City of Port-of-Spain in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago:

And whereas it is enacted by section 10(3) of the Constitution that the Proclamation may be revoked at any time by a resolution supported by a simple majority vote of the House of Representatives:

And whereas the circumstances which gave rise to the declaration of the said state of emergency no longer exist:

And whereas it is necessary and expedient that the Proclamation made by the President on the 3rd day of August, 1995 declaring that a state of emergency exists in the City of Port-of-Spain in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, should be revoked:

Now, therefore,

*Be it Resolved,*

That the Proclamation made by the President on the 3rd day of August, 1995 declaring that a state of emergency exists in the City of Port-of-Spain in the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago be revoked with immediate effect.

Passed in the House of Representatives this 7th day of August, 1995.
