**AN ACT for the incorporation of the St. Joseph's Convent
Port-of-Spain Past Pupils Association**

[Assented to 6th August, 1991]

**WHEREAS the St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain Past ^{Preamble}
Pupils Association was inaugurated on the 24th day of
May, 1964.**

And whereas it is expedient that the St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain Past Pupils Association be incorporated:

Enactment	ENACTED by the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago as follows:—
Short title	1. This Act may be cited as the St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain Past Pupils Association (Incorporation) Act, 1991.
Incorporation	2. The St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain Past Pupils Association (hereinafter referred to as "the Association") is hereby created a body corporate.
Aims and objects	3. The aims and objects of the Association are— <ol style="list-style-type: none">(a) to afford its members the means of social interaction and recreation, mutual helpfulness, mental and moral improvement;(b) to foster among past pupils a spirit of loyalty to their alma mater;(c) to bring past pupils into more intimate association with present pupils for their mutual benefit;(d) to promote the interests of St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain in every manner possible;(e) to undertake, promote, establish and carry out any activity of an educational nature for the benefit of the St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain;(f) to establish and maintain funds by means of subscriptions, contributions or otherwise for the objects of the Association;(g) to support and subscribe to any body, institution or association that is sporting, educational or charitable in nature;(h) to consider and if necessary make public comment on any matter affecting the moral or educational welfare of the people of Trinidad and Tobago;(i) to take over the members, assets, rights and franchises of the unincorporated club known as the St. Joseph's Convent Port-of-Spain Past Pupils Association;

- (j) to print and publish any books, newsletters, bulletins, magazines or leaflets that the Association may think desirable for the promotion of its objects;
- (k) to invest the monies of the Association not immediately required for its objects, in or upon such investments, securities or property as may be thought fit, subject nevertheless to such conditions and such contents, as may for the time being be imposed or required by law; and
- (l) to do all such other lawful things as are incidental to or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects mentioned above.

4. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the Association shall have power— Powers of the Association

- (a) to acquire by purchase, transfer, donation, exchange, demise, bequest, grant, gift, conveyance or howsoever otherwise, any real or personal property or any estate or interest therein;
- (b) to accept surrenders or reconveyances and enter into contracts;
- (c) subject to any restraint, reservation or condition contained in the document under which it has acquired title, to sell, exchange, demise, mortgage or otherwise dispose of and deal with all or any property which may for the time being be vested in it.

(2) The Association shall not support with its funds any object or endeavour to impose on or procure to be observed by its members, any regulation, restriction or condition which if an object of the Association would make it a trade union.

5. The income and property of the Association shall be applied solely towards the promotion of the objects of the Association and no portion thereof shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend bonus or by way of profit to the members of the Association. Application of Income to the Association

Mode of execution of documents

6. All documents requiring the seal of the Association shall be sealed with the common seal of the Association in the presence of the President and Secretary for the time being in office who shall both sign every such document and such signing shall be *prima facie* evidence that the said seal was duly affixed and that the same is the lawful seal of the Association.

Service of documents

7. (1) The Association shall at all times have a fixed address in Trinidad and Tobago for the service of documents on it and this address and any change thereof shall be registered with the Registrar General within twenty-eight days of incorporation or the change of address as the case may be.

(2) Every document to be served on the Association may be served by leaving the same at or by sending the same by registered post to the registered address of the Association.

(3) Failure to register the address and any change thereof is a summary offence and renders the Association liable to a fine of one hundred and twenty dollars and to a further fine of ten dollars for each day during which the offence continues after conviction therefor.

Power to make rules

8. The Association may make rules for the proper conduct of its proceedings and the discharge of its functions and may vary or revoke such rules.

Saving of State or other Rights

9. Nothing in this Act shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of the State, or of any bodies politic or corporate or of any persons, except such as are mentioned or referred to in this Act and those claiming by, through, from or under them.
