ORDER

MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 68(1) OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) (ST. JAMES CHILDREN'S CARNIVAL) ORDER, 1994

Citation

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Provisions) (St. James Children's Carnival) Order, 1994.

Commencement and cessation

2. This Order has effect between the hours of 12.00 noon and 7.00 p.m. on Sunday, 6th February, 1994.

Roads closed

3. Parking and vehicular traffic are prohibited on the following roads:

- (a) Western Main Road, between Long Circular Road and George Cabral Street;
- (b) all streets intersecting with Western Main Road, between Long Circular Road and George Cabral Street.

Alternative routes

4. Motorists proceeding—

- (a) West along Western Main Road, shall turn North into Long Circular Road, West into Delhi Street, then into Kathleen Street and South into George Cabral Street, re-entering Western Main Road;
- (b) East along Western Main Road, shall turn North into George Cabral Street, East into Kathleen Street, then into Delhi Street and South into Long Circular Road, re-entering Western Main Road.

Parking prohibited

5. Parking is prohibited on the following roads:

- (a) Long Circular Road, between Delhi Street and Western Main Road;
- (b) George Cabral Street, between Kathleen Street and Western Main Road;
- (c) Western Main Road, between Coronation Street and Roxy Roundabout;
- (d) Delhi Street, between Kathleen Street and Long Circular Road.

6. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order may be removed by the Police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
