ORDER

MADE BY THE MINISTER OF WORKS AND TRANSPORT UNDER SECTION 65
OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC CONTROL (TAXI STANDS) (PORT-OF-SPAIN AND
SAN JUAN) PARKING ORDER, 2018

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Control (Taxi Stands) Citation
(Port-of-Spain and San Juan) Parking Order, 2018.

2. This Order shall take effect on Monday 26th February, 2018. Commencement

PART I

PORT-OF-SPAIN

3. Taxi drivers shall park and ply for hire as follows: Taxi stands

- (a) the Port-of-Spain General Hospital route—a maximum of ten taxis on the northern side of South Quay, between Charlotte Street and George Street, facing east;
- (b) the Port-of-Spain General Hospital to City Gate route—a maximum of twelve taxis, on the northern side of Belmont Circular Road, from a point forty metres east of Charlotte Street extending to a point one hundred and fifty metres east of Charlotte Street, facing east;
- (c) the Morvant route—a maximum of twelve taxis, on the western side of George Street, from a point nine metres south of Independence Square South extending to a point one hundred metres south of Independence Square South, facing north, without blocking any driveways; and
- (d) the Trou Macaque route—a maximum of eight taxis, on the eastern side of George Street, from a point nine metres south of Independence Square South extending to a point fifty metres south of Independence Square South, facing north, without blocking any driveways.

4. A person driving a motor vehicle, with the exception of a taxi driver plying for hire, shall not park, stop or wait along Belmont Circular Road from Charlotte Street to a point thirty metres east of Charlotte Street. No parking, stopping or waiting

SAN JUAN

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| Taxi stands | <p>5. Taxi drivers shall park and ply for hire as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (a) the El Socorro route—a maximum of twelve taxis, on the southern side of Railway Road, from a point nine metres west of El Socorro Road extending to a point one hundred metres west of El Socorro Road, facing west; (b) the Barataria route—a maximum of nine taxis, on the northern side of Railway Road, from a point nine metres east of Saddle Road extending to a point seventy-five metres east of Saddle Road, facing east; and (c) the Aranguez route—a maximum of nine taxis, on the northern side of Railway Road, from a point seventy-six metres east of Saddle Road extending to a point one hundred and fifty metres east of Saddle Road, facing east. |

penalty | <p>6. Any person who contravenes this Order commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of three thousand dollars or to imprisonment for three months.</p> |
| Removal and

Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order, may be removed by the police and impounded and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.</p> |
