MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 68(1) OF THE
MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS)
(ARIMA BOROUGH DAY CELEBRATIONS) ORDER, 2018

1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (Temporary Provisions) (Arima Borough Day Celebrations) Order, 2018. Citation

2. This Order shall have effect from 4.00 a.m. to 12.00 midnight on Saturday 11th August, 2018. Duration

3. A driver of a motor vehicle entering Arima—

- (a) from the west, shall proceed along the Eastern Main Road, north onto King Street, along Sanchez Street, north along Prince Street to El Carmen Street, east along Columbus Street to Moreno Street, east onto Guanapo Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road;
- (b) from the east, shall proceed along Guanapo Street, south onto Quesnel Street, continuing west and then south onto Pro Queen Street; and
- (c) from the south, shall proceed along Cocorite Street and then west onto Quesnel Street.

4. A driver of a maxi-taxi proceeding east along the Priority Bus Route shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Industry Street, east along Anglican Street, north along King Street, east onto Sanchez Street, south onto St. Joseph Street and then onto the Priority Bus Route maxi-taxi stand. 5. A driver of a maxi-taxi on the Eastern Main Road proceeding to Arima shall proceed north onto Industry Street, east along Anglican Street, north onto King Street, east onto Rose Street, north onto St. Joseph Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road maxi-taxi stand. Eastern Main

6. A driver of a bus proceeding east along the Priority Bus Route shall turn north onto Railway Road, north onto Queen Mary Avenue, west onto John Shaw Avenue and then onto the stand on the southern side of John Shaw Avenue, facing west, in front of the Arima Health Centre.

7. A driver of a motor vehicle shall not park or proceed on—
- (a) Queen Street, between Sorzano Street and Hollis Avenue;
 - (b) Hollis Avenue, between King Street and Queen Street; and
 - (c) Woodford Street, between Hollis Avenue and Green Street.
- Parking
prohibited
8. A driver of a motor vehicle shall not park on—
- (a) Cocorite Road, between Broadway and Maurice Avenue;
 - (b) King Street, between Hollis Avenue and Green Street; and
 - (c) Anglican Street, between Industry Street and King Street.
- Bus routes
9. A driver of a Public Transport Service Corporation bus proceeding to—
- (a) Arima from the east along Guanapo Street, shall proceed west onto Broadway, south onto Cocorite Road and then onto Devenish Street; and
 - (b) Sangre Grande, shall proceed north along King Street, east along Sanchez Street, east along El Carmen Street onto Moreno Street, east along Guanapo Street and then onto the Eastern Main Road.
- Maxi-taxi
stands
10. A driver of a maxi-taxi shall operate—
- (a) a Sangre Grande maxi-taxi on the eastern side of Raglan Street, facing south, between Sorzano Street and Guanapo Street; and
 - (b) an Eastern Main Road maxi-taxi, and a Priority Bus Route maxi-taxi, on their respective stands on St. Joseph Street.
- Taxi stands
11. A driver of a taxi shall operate—
- (a) a Port-of-Spain, Mt. Pleasant, Calvary, Cumuto, La Horquetta, Sangre Grande/Valencia, Pinto and San Rafael taxi respectively, from its current location;

- (b) a Mausica Old Road taxi from King Street, facing north;
and
- (c) a Malabar taxi and a Carapo taxi respectively, from
Devenish Street, on the southern side, facing east.

12. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order may be removed and impounded by a police officer in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act. Removal and impounding of vehicles unlawfully parked
