THE IMMIGRATION (RESTRICTION) ORDINANCE, CH. 20. No. 2

ORDER

*(Made by the Governor in Council under section 4 (1) (g) of the Immigration (Restriction) Ordinance)*

THE IMMIGRATION (RESTRICTION) (CLASSES OF UNDESIRABLE IMMIGRANTS) ORDER, 1953

IN exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of section 4 of the Immigration (Restriction) Ordinance, the following Order is hereby made:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Immigration (Restriction) (Classes of Undesirable Immigrants) Order, 1953.

2. The following classes of persons, not being persons who belong to the Colony, are hereby deemed on economic grounds to be undesirable immigrants:—

- (a) persons who wish to enter the Colony, or who enter remain or are at the date of this Order in the Colony, for the purpose of engaging in work in any capacity mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, other than persons permitted prior to the date of this Order to enter or remain or be in the Colony on the specific ground that they were not prohibited immigrants and other than persons exempted under subsection (2) of section 4 of the Immigration (Restriction) Ordinance;
- (b) persons who wish to enter the Colony, or who enter remain or are at the date of this Order in the Colony, for the alleged purpose of engaging in work in any capacity not mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, but who fail to satisfy an immigration officer that they are skilled or experienced and bona fide intend to work or occupy themselves exclusively in such capacity, other than persons permitted prior to the date of this Order to enter or remain or be in the Colony on the specific ground that they were not prohibited immigrants and other than persons exempted under subsection (2) of section 4 of the Immigration (Restriction) Ordinance;
- (c) persons who, having been permitted to enter the Colony for any other purpose or in any other capacity, subsequently engage in work in any capacity mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

3. In sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of paragraph 2 of this Order the expression "persons wishing to enter the Colony" shall be deemed to include persons who present themselves to an immigration officer under subsection (3) of section 13 of the Immigration (Restriction) Ordinance, but who fail or are not entitled to obtain any extension under the said section of the period for which permits under the said section have been granted to them.

4. The Immigration (Prohibited Class) Order, 1950, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or suffered thereunder.
