MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 68(1) OF
THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC RESTRICTION (NATIONAL DAY OF REMEM-
BRANCE) (TEMPORARY PROVISIONS) ORDER, 1982

- Citation** 1. This Order may be cited as the Traffic Restriction (National Day of Remembrance) (Temporary Provisions) Order, 1982.
- Duration** 2. This Order has effect from 7.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon on Sunday, 14th November, 1982.
- Parking prohibited** 3. No Person may park any vehicle on any of the roads listed below—
- (a) Queen's Park West, between Queen's Park East and Frederick Street;
 - (b) Keate Street, between Charlotte Street and Chancery Lane;
 - (c) Frederick Street, between Gordon Street and Queen's Park West;
 - (d) Gordon Street, between Charlotte Street and Edward Street;
 - (e) Abercromby Street, between Gordon Street and Keate Street;
 - (f) Pembroke Street, between Gordon Street and Keate Street;
 - (g) New Street, between Pembroke Street and Charlotte Street; and
 - (h) Chancery Lane.
- Parking reserved** 4. (1) Parking on Frederick Street between the western entrance to the Memorial Park and Keate Street is reserved for—
- (a) His Excellency, the President of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (b) The Prime Minister of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (c) The Honourable, the Chief Justice of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (d) His Grace, the Archbishop of Port-of-Spain; and
 - (e) His Lordship, the Bishop of Trinidad and Tobago.
- (2) Parking on Keate Street between Frederick Street and Abercromby Street is reserved for Government Ministers.

(3) Parking on the roads listed below is reserved for members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps—

- (a) Keate Street between Abercromby Street and Chancery Lane;
- (b) on Pembroke Street between Gordon Street and Keate Street; and
- (c) on Abercromby Street between Gordon Street and Keate Street.

(4) Vehicles of persons referred to in paragraphs (2) and (3) are required to bear appropriate windscreen stickers.

(5) Parking on Duprey Drive is reserved for—

- (a) The Honourable Minister of National Security;
- (b) The Commissioner of Police;
- (c) The Chief of Defence Staff;
- (d) The Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Regiment;
- (e) The Commanding Officer of the Trinidad and Tobago Coast Guard; and
- (f) The Officer commanding the Parade.

5. Parking for other vehicles is provided on the Queen's Park Savannah, opposite the Princes Building Grounds, as directed by the police officers on duty, entrance via Frederick Street. Parking

6. (1) The roads listed below are closed to vehicular traffic during the hours stated— Roads closed

- (a) Frederick Street—between Queen's Park West and Keate Street—from 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (b) Queen's Park West—between Queen's Park East and Frederick Street—from 10.30 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (c) Queen's Park East—between Jerningham Avenue and Queen's Park West—from 10.50 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (d) Charlotte Street—between Queen's Park West and Gordon Street—from 10.50 a.m. to 12.00 noon;
- (e) Keate Street—between Charlotte Street and Pembroke Street—from 10.50 a.m. to 12.00 noon.

(2) From 10.50 a.m. to 12.00 noon, vehicular traffic is diverted as follows—

- (a) traffic proceeding South along Queen's Park East is diverted East into Jerningham Avenue;
- (b) traffic proceeding West along Jerningham Avenue is diverted South into Norfolk Street;
- (c) traffic proceeding North along Charlotte Street is diverted West into Gordon Street;
- (d) traffic proceeding East along Gordon Street is diverted South into Charlotte Street;

- (e) traffic proceeding North along Pembroke Street is diverted West into Keate Street;
- (f) traffic proceeding North along Abercromby Street is diverted West into Keate Street.

One-way

7. From 9.00 a.m. to 12.00 noon, vehicular traffic shall proceed—
- (a) in a westerly direction only along Keate Street between Pembroke Street and Chancery Lane; and
 - (b) in an easterly direction only along Jerningham Avenue between Queen's Park East and Norfolk Street.

8. During the "Two Minutes Silence" from 11.00 a.m. to 11.02 a.m. police officers on duty shall bring to a standstill all vehicular traffic within the area bounded by Chancery Lane, Queen's Park West, Queen's Park East, Charlotte Street, Gordon Street, Pembroke Street and Keate Street.

9. Without prejudice to any other liability incurred by the commission of a summary offence, vehicles found parked in contravention of this Order, may be removed by the Police and dealt with in accordance with section 108(1)(b) of the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Act.
