MADE BY THE COMMISSIONER OF POLICE UNDER SECTION 67(1) OF THE
MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ACT

THE TRAFFIC CONTROL [EXPERIMENTAL SCHEME (BARA-
TARIA/ARANGUEZ/CUREPE/TUNAPUNA)] REGULATIONS, 1982

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Traffic Control [Experi- Citation
mental Scheme (Barataria/Aranguez/Curepe/Tunapuna)] Regulations, 1982.

2. These Regulations shall come into operation at 5.00 a.m. on Commence-
Monday, 29th November, 1982 and shall cease at midnight on 28th ment and
February, 1983. cessation

3. (1) Vehicles travelling East along Fifth Street, Barataria may gain access to— Access from
Fifth Street

- (a) Sixth Avenue by turning South into Seventh Avenue and then East into Sixth Street;
- (b) Eastern Main Road by turning North into El Socorro Road.

(2) Vehicles travelling West along Fifth Street may gain access to—

- (a) Sixth Avenue by turning South into Fifth Avenue and then West into Sixth Street;
- (b) Churchill-Roosevelt Highway by turning South into Tenth Avenue.

(3) Vehicles proceeding along Fifth Street are prohibited from turning into Sixth Avenue.

4. Parking is prohibited as follows:—

(a) In Barataria

- (i) on Fifth Street between Seventh Avenue and Fifth Avenue;
- (ii) on Sixth Avenue between Sixth Street and Fifth Street;

(b) In Aranguez

- (i) on Eastern Main Road between Saddle Road and Aranguez Road;
- (ii) on Fifth Street between El Socorro Road and Don Miguel Road;

Parking
prohibited

(c) In Tunapuna

on Centenary Street between Eastern Main Road
and the Priority Bus Route.

Parking
restricted

5. Parking is restricted as follows:—

In Barataria

on Sixth Street:

- (a) to the Southern side of the Street between Sixth Avenue and Fifth Avenue;
- (b) to the northern side of the Street between Seventh Avenue and Sixth Avenue.

stopping

6. Stopping to load or unload goods or to allow any person to alight from or board a vehicle is prohibited on the Eastern Main Road, from a point fifty metres West to a point fifty metres East of:—

- (a) Saddle Road and
- (b) Aranguéz Road.

One-way
traffic

7. Vehicles shall proceed as follows:—

(1) In Barataria

- (a) along Fifth Street between Churchill-Roosevelt Highway and Tenth Avenue in an easterly direction only;
- (b) along Sixth Street,
 - (i) between Seventh Avenue and Sixth Avenue in an easterly direction only;
 - (ii) between Fifth Avenue and Sixth Avenue in a westerly direction only.
- (c) along Fifth Avenue, between Fifth Street and Sixth Street in a southerly direction only;
- (d) along Seventh Avenue between Fifth Street and Sixth Street, in a southerly direction only.

(2) In Aranguéz

Along Aranguéz Road, between Eastern Main Road and Railway Road (Fifth Street) in a southerly direction only.

(3) In Curepe

- (a) along Scott Street, between Eastern Main Road and Sellier Street, in a northerly direction only;
- (b) along Evans Street,
 - (i) East of its intersection with the Southern Main Road, in an easterly direction only;
 - (ii) West of its intersection with the Southern Main Road, in a westerly direction only.

8. Vehicles proceeding along the Eastern Main Road are prohibited from turning North into Riverside Road or South into Southern Main Road. No turning

9. Vehicles travelling along Railway Road are prohibited from turning left into Aranguéz Road. No left
turn

10. First Street is closed to vehicular traffic at its intersection with the Eastern Main Road. Road
closed
