A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by the Forests Ordinance, Ch. 24. No. 1, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any specified area, being part of a Forest Reserve or Crown Lands, shall be a prohibited area within which the entry of any person is restricted except in accordance with the Rules made by the Intendant or with permission in writing of a Forest Officer or Warden thereunto authorised:

And whereas it is expedient to declare the area hereunder specified to be a prohibited area:

Now therefore, I, HUBERT ELVIN RANCE, Governor as aforesaid, do declare the undermentioned Forest Reserve and Crown Lands to be a prohibited area as from the 16th day of July, 1953 until further notice.

All Forest Reserves and Crown Lands on that portion of the Mount Hope Estate comprising 209 acres (approximately) and bounded on the

North by Private Lands
South by Mt. Hope Estate
East by Woodbrook Estate
West by Private Lands.
