A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 2 of the Forests Ordinance, Ch. 24. No. 1, that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare that any specified area, being part of a Forest Reserve or Crown Lands shall be a prohibited area:

Now, therefore, I, HUBERT ELVIN RANCE, Governor as aforesaid by virtue of the foregoing powers, do hereby in Executive Council declare the Crown Lands hereunder described to be a prohibited area as from the 1st November, 1954:—

All those two areas of Crown Land forming part of the Caroni Swamp comprising approximately 337 acres and 100 acres and hereunder described as the Northern and Southern Areas respectively and bounded as follows:—

(1) *Northern Area:*

North—By the southern bank of the Blue River from the western bank of No. 2 (North and South) drain to the western bank of No. 4 (North and South) drain.

South—By a line demarcated by stakes running from the western bank of No. 4 (North and South) drain to the western bank of No. 2 (North and South) drain.

East—By the western bank of No. 2 (North and South) drain.

West—By the western bank of No. 4 (North and South) drain.

(2) *Southern Area:*

North—By a cut line running westwards from the point on the Madame Espagnol River, West of the north-western corner of that parcel of land comprising 52 acres 3 roods 5 perches owned by the Woodford Lodge Estates Limited to the sea.

South and East—By the Madame Espagnol River.

West—By the sea.

Proclamation No. 21 of 1953 is hereby revoked.
