THE AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES ORDINANCE, CH. 33. No. 3

ORDER

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 4 OF THE  
AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES ORDINANCE

THE AID TO PIONEER INDUSTRIES (HOLIDAY FOODS LIMITED)  
(PROCESSING OF FRESH FOODSTUFFS) ORDER, 1967

1. This Order may be cited as the Aid to Pioneer Industries (Holiday Foods Limited) (Processing of Fresh Foodstuffs) Order, 1967.

2. Holiday Foods Limited, a company registered under the Companies Ordinance, Ch. 31. No. 1 (hereinafter referred to as the "pioneer company") is hereby declared to be a pioneer manufacturer for the purposes of the Aid to Pioneer Industries Ordinance (hereinafter referred to as the "Ordinance") in relation to—

(a) its pioneer factory located at El Socorro Road, San Juan, in the Ward of St. Ann's, and

(b) the processing of fresh foodstuffs on a factory scale (by the Aid to Pioneer Industries (Processing of Fresh Foodstuffs) Order, 1964, declared to be a pioneer industry),

with effect from the 1st day of July, 1967 and the production day of the said factory is hereby declared to be the 1st day of July, 1967.

3. The effect of this Order shall be restricted to the processing of fresh vegetables (other than pigeon peas) and fresh fruits.

4. This Order is subject to the following continuing conditions:—

(a) that the pioneer company shall keep its pioneer factory equipped with plant and machinery capable of processing a minimum of 25,000 pounds of fresh vegetables (other than pigeon peas) or 25,000 pounds of fresh fruits per week;

(b) that the pioneer company shall comply with the standards from time to time established by law relating to qualities, grades and other requirements of foodstuffs processed in Trinidad and Tobago;

(c) that the pioneer company shall keep in operation a plant or plants in Trinidad and Tobago for the processing of fresh potatoes, fresh plantains, fresh breadfruit, fresh chataigne, fresh cashew nuts and fresh chick peas;

(d) that the pioneer company shall maintain accounts in respect of the pioneer enterprise to the satisfaction of the Board of Inland Revenue;

(e) that, notwithstanding, the exemption from income tax under section 8 of the Ordinance, the pioneer company shall submit

annually a return of the income so exempt from tax at the same time and in the same manner as it would be required to do if the income were not exempt from tax;

(f) that the pioneer company shall—

- (i) observe the practice and policy generally accepted in Trinidad and Tobago with respect to labour relations and conditions of employment,
- (ii) as far as practicable recruit its employees through the Employment Exchange of the Ministry of Labour.
