AN ACT to amend the Interpretation Act, 1962.

[Assented to 19th April, 1972]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by **Enactment** and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives of Trinidad and Tobago, and by the authority of the same, as follows: —

1. This Act may be cited as the Interpretation (Amend- **Short title** ment) Act, 1972.

2. Section 59 of the Interpretation Act, 1962, is repealed and replaced as follows:—

59. (1) Where there is a change in the title of an officer in any classification of offices made by Order under the Civil Service Act, 1965, the Police Service Act, 1965, the Fire Service Act, 1965, the Prison Service Act, 1965, or the Education Act, 1966, as the case may be, the new title replaces the old title wherever the old title appears in any enactment or in any document made or issued pursuant to or consequent upon such enactment.

(2) Where there is a change in the title of any officer or employee of a statutory authority, in any classification of offices established under the Statutory Authorities Act, 1966 and published in the *Gazette* the new title replaces the old title wherever the old title appears in any enactment or in any document made or issued pursuant to or consequent upon such enactment.

(3) For the purposes of subsection (2)—

“local authority” means the Port-of-Spain Corporation established under the Port-of-Spain Corporation Ordinance, the San Fernando Corporation established under the San Fernando Corporation Ordinance, the Arima Corporation established under the Arima Corporation Ordinance and a County Council established under the County Councils Act, 1967;

“statutory authority” means a local authority and any commission, board, committee, council or body (whether corporate or unincorporated), established by or under a public general statute other than the Companies Ordinance.”
