AN ORDINANCE to amend the Lands and Buildings  
Taxes Ordinance, Cap. 204.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Lands and Buildings Taxes (Amendment) Ordinance, 1936, and shall be read as one with the Lands and Buildings Taxes Ordinance hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 23 of the Criminal Justice Ordinance, 1928, is hereby repealed and Section 7 of the Principal Ordinance shall have effect as if the following proviso were added at the end thereof:

Provided that a complaint for an offence against this section shall be made within three years from the time when the matter of such complaint arose, and not after.

3. The following sub-section shall be added to Section 15 of the Principal Ordinance:—

(5) Whenever, at any time after the completion of any Assessment Roll or Amended Assessment Roll, a new building is erected in a County or Ward, the Warden of the said County or Ward shall as soon as is practicable after the building is substantially
