THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)  
(NO. 7) ORDER, 2001

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 7) Order, 2001.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

James Dalglish Guthrie	Of the Honourable Society of the Inner Temple, Barrister, admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in July, 1975.

PART II

Mr. James Dalglish Guthrie, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in the High Court and the Court of Appeal in relation to High Court Action No. 1127 of 2001—Clint Gocking and Troy Gocking v. The Attorney General, Commissioner of Police and Comptroller of Customs and Excise and any matter, suit or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the said matter.
