THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 10) ORDER, 2001

Citation 1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 10) Order, 2001.

Eligibility for admission to practise 2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago, subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

PART I

Name	Academic Qualification
Douglas Mark Arthur Strachan	Of the Honourable Society of the Inner Temple; Barrister-at-law; admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in 1969.

PART II

Mr. Douglas Mark Arthur Strachan, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney-at-law in the High Court and the Court of Appeal in relation to the following causes and any matter, suit or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the said matters namely:

- (a) High Court Action No. S-395 of 2001 Dhanraj Singh v. The Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago and The Director of Public Prosecutions;
- (b) High Court Action No. S-475 of 2001 Dhanraj Singh v. The Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago and The Director of Public Prosecutions.
