MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LEGAL AFFAIRS AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE
CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
ORDER, 2003

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) Order, 2003.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, Eligibility Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago, subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

PART I

Mr. Stephen Edmund Phillips, Q.C., is to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in relation to the following cause, namely, High Court Action No. 1389 of 2003 between the Telecommunications Services of Trinidad and Tobago Limited and Scotiabank Trinidad and Tobago Limited.
