MADE BY THE MINISTER AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE
UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 11) ORDER, 2006

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 11) Order, 2006.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

PART I

<i>Name</i>	<i>Professional Qualification</i>
Keir Starmer, Q.C.	Of the Honourable Society of Middle Temple; Barrister; admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in November, 1987 and appointed Queen's Counsel in 2002.

PART II

Mr. Keir Starmer, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in relation to the following causes and any matter, suit or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the said matters namely:

- (a) in the matter of the State vs Carlos John, Ishwar Galbaransingh and others on 3rd January, 2007 in the 1st Magistrate's Court before Her Worship Ejenny Espinet;
- (b) High Court Action No. CV 2006-02959—Steve Ferguson and Ishwar Galbaransingh vs John Jeremie (Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago) and His Worship Sherman Mc Nicolls (Chief Magistrate) before Justice Nolan Bereaux from 8th–12th January, 2007;

- (c) in the matter of Superintendent Maurice Piggott vs Brian Kuei Tung, Ishwar Galbaransingh and others on 25th January, 2007 in the 1st Magistrate's Court before Her Worship Ejenny Espinet; and
- (d) extradition proceedings before His Worship Sherman Mc Nicolls, Chief Magistrate, on 15th January, 2007 in the 8th Magistrate's Court.
