UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 7) ORDER, 2007

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 7) Order, 2007.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in Canada for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

PART I

Michael Steven Koch	Of the Law Society of Upper Canada; admitted to practise at the Bar of Ontario and admitted as a solicitor in April, 1988.

PART II

Mr. Michael Steven Koch, is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in relation to the following cause and any matter, suit or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the said matter, namely:
