MADE BY THE MINISTER AFTER CONSULTATION WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE
UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 18) ORDER, 2007

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 18) Order, 2007.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule, being a Commonwealth citizen admitted to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule.

PART I

Mr. James Thomas Lewis, Q.C.	Of the Honourable Society of Gray's Inn; Barrister; admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in July, 1987 and appointed Queen's Counsel in 2002.

PART II

Mr. James Thomas Lewis, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an attorney-at-law in relation to the following causes and any matters, suits or other proceedings arising out of or in connection with the said causes, namely:

Claim C.V. 2007-01825—Ishwar Galbaransingh v. The Attorney General of Trinidad and Tobago.

Claim C.V. 2007-03062—Abdul Kadir and Kareem Ibrahim v. The Commissioner of Prisons.

Claim C.V. 2007-03063—Abdul Nur v. The Commissioner of Prisons.
