A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 71 of the National Insurance Act, 1971, that the said Act shall come into operation on a day or days appointed by the Governor-General by Proclamation published in the *Gazette* and that the Governor-General may appoint different days for different provisions of the Act and in particular for provisions relating to different benefits or descriptions of benefits under the Act or for the application of different provisions of the Act to different categories of persons:

Now, therefore, I, SOLOMON HOCHOY, Governor-General as aforesaid hereby appoint the 15th November, 1971, to be the day on which the provisions of section 1 to section 27, the provisions of Part II save in their application to self-employed persons, and the provisions of sections 56, 62, 69, 70, 71 and 72 of Part IV, of the said Act shall come into operation.
