### A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 71 of the National Insurance Act, 1971, that the said Act shall come into operation on a day or days to be appointed by the Governor-General by Proclamation published in the *Gazette* and that the Governor-General may appoint different days for different provisions of the Act and in particular for provisions relating to the payment of different benefits or descriptions of benefits under the Act or for the application of different provisions of the Act to different categories of persons:

Now, therefore, I, ELLIS EMMANUEL INNOCENT CLARKE, Governor-General, as aforesaid, hereby appoint the 17th day of February, 1975 to be the day on which the provisions of section 44(1)(e) of the Act shall come into operation, save in their application to self-employed persons and persons employed by more than one person within the meaning of section 43 of the Act.
