AN ORDINANCE to validate certain expired liquor licences.

[3rd May, 1956.]

Commence-
ment.

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof.

Enactment.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Liquor Licences (Temporary Extension) Ordinance, 1956, and shall be read as one with the Liquor Licences Ordinance, 1955.

Short title.

Validation
of licences

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to declare that a licence preserved by paragraph (a) of subsection (2) of section 88 of the Liquor Licences Ordinance, 1955, and in force on the 31st day of March, 1956, be continued in force thereafter notwithstanding the provisions of the said paragraph.

(2) The provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of the said subsection shall be deemed to apply to any licence in respect of which the Governor shall make a declaration under subsection (1) hereof.

(3) Every such declaration shall specify a time, in no case later than the expiry of this Ordinance, after which any such licence shall cease to have effect.

Commencement
and duration.

3. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have come into force on the thirty-first day of March, 1956, and shall expire on the thirtieth day of June, 1956, but without prejudice to anything previously done or omitted thereunder.

Passed in Council this sixth day of April, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-six.
