REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 25(1)(h) OF THE
FOOD AND DRUGS ORDINANCE, 1960

THE FOOD AND DRUGS (ANGOSTURA AROMATIC BITTERS)
(EXEMPTION) REGULATIONS, 1970

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Food and Drugs (Angostura Aromatic Bitters) (Exemption) Regulations, 1970.

(2) These Regulations shall have effect for a period of five years but may from time to time be extended by Order of the Governor-General, for such periods as may be stated in any such order.

2. Angostura Aromatic Bitters is hereby exempted to the extent set out hereunder from the provisions of the Food and Drugs Ordinance (hereinafter called "the Ordinance"), that is to say—

(a) subsection (1) and paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (2) of section 3 of the Ordinance shall not apply to the manufacturers thereof;

(b) no inspector may—

(i) enter the two rooms (marked secret on a plan deposited with the Chief Chemist and Director of Foods and Drugs) at premises on George Street, Port-of-Spain nor require any person on such premises to produce any botanical or other ingredients or any article used in the manufacture, preparation, packaging or storage of any such ingredient and stored in the said two rooms;

(ii) examine any books, documents or other records certified by the manufacturers, as containing information relating to botanical or other ingredients or to the process used in preparing these ingredients before extraction with alcohol for the manufacture of Angostura Aromatic Bitters, or any customs entries of botanical ingredients, or take samples of any such ingredient, imported into Trinidad and Tobago for use in such manufacture.

3. The Food and Drugs (Angostura Aromatic Bitters) (Exemption) Regulations, 1966, are hereby revoked.
