REGULATIONS

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 25 OF THE
FOOD AND DRUGS ORDINANCE

THE FOOD AND DRUGS (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS, 1974

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Food and Drugs (Amendment) Citation (No. 2) Regulations, 1974.

2. The First Schedule to the Food and Drugs Regulations is amended G.N. No. 130 of 1964 amended in Division 7—

(a) by adding immediately after item (xi) of subparagraph (a) of paragraph 1 thereof, the following new item:—

“(xii) nisin in canned foods, provided that the cans are hermetically sealed and the foods sufficiently heat processed so as to destroy any clostridium botulinum in the foods or cans, or nisin in canned foods with a P^H of less than 4.5, or in cheese clotted cream;”;

(b) by adding immediately after item (iii) of subparagraph (b) of paragraph 1 thereof the following new items:—

“(iv) methyl para-hydroxybenzoate;
(v) propyl para-hydroxybenzoate;”;

(c) by deleting the word “or” appearing immediately after the word “acid” in subparagraph (e) of paragraph 5 thereof and adding immediately after subparagraph (f) thereof the following new subparagraphs:—

“(g) methyl para-hydroxybenzoate;
(h) propyl para-hydroxybenzoate;
(i) nisin;”;

(d) by deleting the word “or” appearing immediately after the words “calculated as benzoic acid” in subparagraph (a) of paragraph 7 thereof and adding immediately after subparagraph (b) thereof, the following new subparagraphs—

“(c) 1000 parts per million of methyl para-hydroxybenzoate;
or
(d) 1000 parts per million of methyl para-hydroxybenzoate.”.
