WITH THE CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL
PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 2) ORDER, 1999

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) (No. 2) Order, 1999.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in the United Kingdom for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

PART I

Name	Academic Qualification
Mr. Andrew Robert Mitchell	Of the Honourable Society of the Gray's Inn; Barrister-at-law; admitted to practise at the Bar of the United Kingdom on the 29th day of July, 1976.

PART II

Mr. Andrew Robert Mitchell, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney-at-Law in relation to the following cause, and any matter, suit or other proceeding arising out of or in connection therewith namely Information Nos. 21530-21533/98; Corporal Wayne Gilkes v Christine Anderson, Albert Baboolal, Indira Devi Ramcharan *et al.*”.
