AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF
PUBLIC RECREATION GROUNDS AND PASTURES.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Recreation
Grounds and Pastures Ordinance.

Short title.

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to make rules
and regulations as to the use by the public of any public
recreation ground or pasture, as to the times during which,
and the terms and conditions under which, persons, horses,
and carriages and other vehicles, cattle and other animals
may be admitted to any such ground or pasture.

Rules and
regulations.

(2) Every person contravening any of such rules and
regulations shall be liable, on summary conviction, before a
Magistrate or Justice, to such penalty as is provided by the
rules and regulations, or, if no penalty is so provided, to a
fine of ten dollars.

3. It shall be lawful for any member of the Police Force,
or any other person appointed by the Governor in that
behalf, to arrest without warrant any person who, within
his view, commits any breach of any rule or regulation
made under this Ordinance, if the name and address of such
person is unknown to such member of the Police Force or
person, or if such person continues to commit such breach
after being warned to desist, and to detain him in custody
until he can be conveniently brought before a Magistrate
or Justice to be dealt with according to law.

Power to
arrest.

4. This Ordinance shall not apply to the Queen's Park
in Port-of-Spain.
