**REMISSION OF PENALTIES.**

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE REMISSION OF PENALTIES.

Ordinance  
Cap. 34-1925.

[20th August, 1886.]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Remission of Penalties Ordinance. Short title.

2. It shall be lawful for the Governor to remit in whole or in part any sum of money which under any Ordinance may be imposed as a penalty or forfeiture on a convicted offender, although such money may be in whole or in part payable to some party other than the Crown, and to extend the Royal Mercy to any person who may be imprisoned for non-payment of any sum of money so imposed, although the same may be in whole or in part payable to some party other than the Crown.
