AN ORDINANCE to amend the Registration of Deeds Ordinance, No. 57.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Registration of Deeds Ordinance 1908. It shall be read as one with the Registration of Deeds Ordinance, No. 57. Short title.

2. In any case in which a deed is executed out of this Colony, the oath or solemn declaration of the witness proving such execution may be made before a Notary Public, and the making of such oath or declaration may be certified under the hand and seal of such Notary. Execution of deeds out of the Colony.

3. Any such deed the execution of which is so proved may, if executed and attested in accordance with the provisions of the Registration of Deeds Ordinance (No. 57) be registered and admitted in evidence in the same manner as if the execution of such deed had been proved in accordance with the provisions of the said Ordinance. 4. This Ordinance shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of May, 1905.
