AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE QUEEN'S PARK.

Commencement.

[5th December, 1882.]

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Queen's Park Ordinance.

Regulations.

2. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to make regulations as to the use by the public of the Queen's Park, as to the times during which and the conditions under which persons, boats and carriages, cattle and other animals may be admitted to the said Park.

(2) Every person offending against any such regulation shall be liable, on summary conviction, to such penalty as is provided by the regulations, or, if no penalty is so provided, to a penalty of ten dollars.

Arrest.

3. It shall be lawful for any constable, or any other person appointed by the Governor in this behalf, to arrest without warrant any person who within his view commits any breach of any regulation made under this Ordinance, if the name and address of such person is unknown to such constable, or if such person continues to commit such breach after being warned to desist, and to detain him in custody until he can be conveniently brought before a Magistrate to be dealt with according to law.

Saving.

4. Nothing in this Ordinance shall prejudice or in any manner affect—

(a) the Races Ordinance; or

(b) any right, power, estate, title, or interest of His Majesty, or of the Governor in right of His Majesty; or

(c) any private right of sepulture or of way, or any other private right in, to, over, or upon the said Queen's Park or any part thereof.
