### A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is provided by section 30 of the Representation of the People Act, Chap. 2:01 that for the purposes of an election the President may, by Proclamation published in the *Trinidad and Tobago Gazette*, direct that an electoral registration shall be conducted in the electoral district in which such election is to be held:

And whereas it is further provided by the said section that the President may, by subsequent Proclamation published in the *Gazette*, fix the date of the termination of an electoral registration:

And whereas by Proclamation dated 10th May, 1999, it was directed that an electoral registration be conducted in each of the undermentioned districts as defined in the Schedule to the Elections and Boundaries Commission (Local Government) Order, 1999, in relation to the electoral area of Chaguanas for the purpose of the election of a Member to serve on the Council of the Corporation of the Borough of Chaguanas and the 11th day of May, 1999 was fixed as the commencement of the said electoral registration:

Now, therefore, I, ARTHUR NAPOLEON RAYMOND ROBINSON, President as aforesaid, do hereby fix the 10th day of September, 1999, as the date of the termination of the electoral registration in each of the undermentioned districts as defined in the Schedule to the Elections and Boundaries Commission (Local Government) Order, 1999.

The electoral districts to which this Proclamation relates are:

1. Charlieville;
2. Cunupia;
3. Edinburgh/Longdenville;
4. Enterprise North;
5. Enterprise South;
6. Felicity/Endeavour;
7. Montrose; and
8. Munroe Road/Caroni Savannah.
