

4. (1) The Governor in Council, whenever he may deem it necessary, may require sufficient means of transport to be kept by any officer for the performance of his duties, and shall prescribe the allowance to which any such officer shall be entitled for the upkeep of such means of transport: Provided always, that whenever any such means of transport shall not be available for travelling in and for the performance of such duties, the allowance in respect thereof shall cease to be paid.

Transport allowance.

(2) Every officer entitled to such allowance shall, before payment thereof, furnish a certificate that he has kept the requisite means of transport during the past month for the performance of his public duties.

5. Officers whilst properly travelling and absent from their stations on the public service shall, subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and any regulations hereunder, when the Governor is satisfied that they have used due diligence and dispatch in the performance of such service, be entitled to receive for such travelling and absence a subsistence allowance in accordance with regulations to be made by the Governor in Council.

Subsistence allowance.

6. No subsistence allowance shall be payable under this Ordinance to any officer for the time he is on board any ship in which his passage, inclusive of board, shall be provided at the expense of the Colony.

No subsistence allowance when passage and board provided.

7. All applications for subsistence allowances shall be accompanied by a return in such form as may be prescribed in the regulations made under this Ordinance.

Application for allowance.

8. The Governor in Council may, in the case of any officer, fix an inclusive allowance in respect of both transport and subsistence on such conditions as he may consider to be fair and reasonable.

Inclusive allowance.

9. Where an officer travels, or is sent upon any service in which it is necessary for him to incur more than ordinary expense, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall see fit, to authorise the payment to such officer of an allowance not

Special allowance.

exceeding the rate of four dollars and eighty cents for each twelve hours during the whole or any part of the time during which such officer is travelling or engaged upon such service.

Transfer
expenses.

10. Where an officer shall be transferred from one station to another, and the circumstances are such that no allowance will become payable to such officer, it shall be lawful for the Governor to authorise the repayment to such officer of any actual out-of-pocket expenses which he may necessarily have incurred in connection with such transfer.
