A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by section 6 of the Public Holidays Ordinance, Ch. 42. No. 1, it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time, as he may see fit, by proclamation under the Public Seal of the Colony to appoint a special day to be kept as a close holiday in all public offices and in all banks in the Colony.

Now, therefore, I, HUBERT ELVIN RANCE, Governor as aforesaid do hereby appoint Wednesday the 25th of November, 1953, to be kept as a close holiday in all public offices and in all banks in the Colony, to mark the occasion of Her Majesty's visit to Jamaica.

TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES REGULATIONS

REGULATIONS MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL UNDER THE
TRAVELLING ALLOWANCES ORDINANCE, CH. 9. No. 12.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Travelling Allowances (Amendment) Regulations, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Travelling Allowances Regulations, 1953, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 41 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and replaced by the following Regulation, with effect from the 1st January, 1953:—

“Allowances to Officers on transfer for travelling between residence and station”
41. (1) Where an Officer is transferred to a district and housing accommodation is not readily available in that district or the period of the Officer's transfer is not sufficiently long to justify requiring him to reside in that district, and he continues to reside in his former district, he shall be eligible for the following allowances for travelling between his residence and his station:—

(a) if he has been transferred temporarily, and—

(i) is required to keep or authorised to use a motor vehicle in either his former or his new district, an allowance at the rates set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to these Regulations;

- (ii) is not required to keep or authorised to use a motor vehicle in either his former or his new district but keeps and uses a motor vehicle, an allowance at the rates set out in Part I (b) (ii) of the Second Schedule to these Regulations for two-thirds of the mileage travelled;
- (b) if he has been transferred permanently, and—
 - (i) keeps and uses a motor vehicle, an allowance at the rates set out in Part I (b) (ii) of the Second Schedule to these Regulations for two-thirds of the mileage travelled;
 - (ii) does not keep a motor vehicle, such allowances as may be approved by the Financial Secretary based on such other means of transport as may be approved by him.

(2) No Officer shall be allowed to claim for more than one return journey per day between his residence and his Station in his new district.

(3) Except with the permission of the Financial Secretary, allowances granted under this Regulation shall not continue longer than six months in the case of a temporary transfer and three months in the case of a permanent transfer.”
