MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LEGAL AFFAIRS AFTER CONSULTATION WITH  
THE CHIEF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 15A OF THE LEGAL  
PROFESSION ACT

THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)  
ORDER, 2000

1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for Admission) Order, 2000.

2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in England and Wales for not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in Part II of the Schedule:

Name	Academic Qualification
Mr. Jonathan Crystal	Of the Honourable Society of the Middle Temple; Barrister-at-law; admitted to practise at the Bar of England and Wales in July, 1972.

PART II

Mr. Jonathan Crystal, is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney-at-law in relation to the following causes and any matter, suit or other proceeding arising out of or in connection therewith namely:

- (1) High Court Action 3314 of 1999 ... In the matter of the Companies Ordinance and Trinidad and Tobago Home Developers Ltd. (In Voluntary Liquidation);
- (2) High Court Action 898 of 1998 ... I.M.H. Investment Ltd. v. Wilfred Sidney Knox and nine others;
