TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY

ENEMY TERRITORY CESSATION (GERMANY)

THE GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance (hereinafter called "the Ordinance"), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Germany) Order, 1953.
2. For the purposes of this Order "Germany" means territory comprised in the German State on the 1st day of March, 1938.
3. Germany shall for the purposes of sections 5A, 6, 7, and 9 of the Ordinance and for the purposes of any Order made under section 9 of the Ordinance, cease to be treated as if it were enemy territory as from the date of this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport)

The Trading with the Enemy Ordinance, Ch. 42. No. 6, made it an offence for any person to trade with or attempt to trade with the enemy within the meaning of the Ordinance.

By virtue of the above order and as from the date thereof, Germany will cease to be regarded as enemy territory for the purposes of sections 5A, 6, 7, and 9 and any order under section 9 of the said Ordinance.
