TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

APPOINTMENT OF COMMISSIONER TO PREPARE A SUPPLEMENT  
OF THE 1950 REVISED EDITION OF THE LAWS OF THE COLONY

(*The Law Revision Ordinance, Ch. 1. No. 1*)

IN exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by section 15 of the Law Revision Ordinance, Ch. 1. No. 1, I, HUBERT ELVIN RANCE, Governor of the Colony of Trinidad and Tobago, do hereby appoint CLIFFORD DE LISLE INNISS, Esquire, q.c., Attorney General, to be the Commissioner for the purpose of preparing a Supplement to the 1950 Revised Edition of the Laws of the Colony containing the Ordinances and Subsidiary Laws enacted during the period 1st January, 1951 to 29th May, 1953.

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY

ENEMY TERRITORY CESSATION (JAPAN)

THE GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 9 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1940, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Japan) Order, 1953.

2. Japan shall for all purposes of the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance, 1939, and for the purposes of any Order made thereunder cease to be treated as if it were enemy territory.

3. In this Order "Japan" means all territory which was under Japanese Sovereignty on the 28th day of September, 1944.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(*This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.*)

Regulation 9 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1939 (as enacted by Regulation 3 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) (Amendment) Regulations, 1944) made the whole of the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance and the Orders made thereunder continue to apply, until the Governor otherwise orders, to areas which were under enemy sovereignty at that date.

By virtue of the present Order, Japan ceases to be regarded as enemy territory for all purposes of the said Ordinance and Orders.
