TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

TRADING WITH THE ENEMY

ENEMY TERRITORY CESSATION (LUXEMBOURG)

THE GOVERNOR, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance (hereinafter called "the Ordinance"), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Enemy Territory Cessation) (Luxembourg) Order, 1953.

2. Luxembourg shall for the purposes of sections 5A, 6, 7 and 9 of the Ordinance and for the purposes of any Order made under section 9 of the Ordinance, cease to be treated as if it were enemy territory as from the date of this Order.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)*

Regulation 8 of the Defence (Trading with the Enemy) Regulations, 1940, continued the Custodian of Enemy control for the purposes of sections 5A, 6, 7 and 9 of the Trading with the Enemy Ordinance, 1939, over the property in the Colony of persons resident in a territory such as Luxembourg which had ceased to be in occupation of the enemy.

The effect of the present Order is to remove this particular control from the money and property of persons resident in or carrying on business in Luxembourg.
