AN ORDINANCE to amend the Teachers' Pensions
Ordinance, Ch. 14. No. 6.

Commencement

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the
advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof. Enactment

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Teachers' Pensions
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with
the Teachers' Pensions Ordinance, in this Ordinance referred
to as the Principal Ordinance. Short title

Section 16 of
Principal
Ordinance

2. Section 16 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by adding thereto the following new subsection to be numbered (4) :—

“(4) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (3) of this section, if a person who has failed to elect under subsection (1) of this section within the time limit prescribed therein wishes to become subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, he may apply to the Governor in Council for permission to be allowed to do so; and if the Governor in Council is satisfied that it would be equitable in the special circumstances of the applicant's case that he should be exempted from the operation of the said time limit, he may direct that the application shall be granted, and the applicant shall thereupon be deemed to be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance.”

Passed in Council this twenty-ninth day of January, in the year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-four.
