AN ORDINANCE to amend the Teachers' Pensions Ordinance,
Ch. 14. No. 6.

[1st January, 1957.]

ENACTED by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the Enactment.

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Teachers' Pensions Short title and
(Amendment) Ordinance, 1957, and shall be read as one with commencement

(2) This Ordinance shall be deemed to have ^{had effect as} come into ~~operation~~ ^{from} on the ~~first~~ ^{5th} day of ~~January~~ ^{August}, 1957.

Subsection (1) of section 13 of Principal Ordinance repealed and new subsections (1) and (1A) inserted in the said section.

2. Subsection (1) of section 13 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following new subsections are hereby inserted in the said section 13 as subsections (1) and (1A) thereof:—

"Gratuity to legal personal representative when teacher dies in teaching service or shortly after retirement therefrom.

13. (1) (a) Where a teacher dies while in teaching service in the Colony, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant a gratuity of an amount not exceeding one year's salary of such teacher, or his commuted pension gratuity, if any, whichever is the greater; and any gratuity so granted shall be paid to his legal personal representative.

(b) For the purposes of this subsection the expression "commuted pension gratuity" means the gratuity, if any, calculated in the manner prescribed in section 9 of this Ordinance, which might have been granted to the teacher if he had retired immediately before his death in circumstances rendering him eligible to receive a gratuity and reduced pension instead of an unreduced pension.

(1A) Where any teacher to whom either an unreduced pension or a gratuity and reduced pension has been granted under this Ordinance, dies after retirement from teaching service in the Colony and the sums paid or payable to him at his death on account of such unreduced pension or gratuity and reduced pension, as the case may be, are less than the annual salary of which he was in receipt at the date of his retirement, it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council to grant a gratuity equal to the deficiency; and any gratuity so granted shall be paid to his legal personal representative."
