THE STATUTORY AUTHORITIES ACT, 1966

DELEGATION OF POWERS BY THE STATUTORY AUTHORITIES
SERVICE COMMISSION UNDER SUBSECTION (2) OF SECTION 5
OF THE STATUTORY AUTHORITIES ACT, 1966.

To: THE INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Under and by virtue of the provisions of subsection (2) of section 5 of the Statutory Authorities Act, 1966 the Statutory Authorities Service Commission, (hereinafter referred to as "the Commission") with the approval of the Prime Minister, hereby delegates to the Industrial Development Corporation (hereinafter referred to as "the Corporation") the respective powers of the Commission detailed hereunder:—

(a) *Acting Appointments*

1. The power to appoint persons to act as officers or servants of the Corporation whether or not any such acting appointment is a prelude to a substantive appointment.

2. In the exercise of the power delegated under paragraph 1 the Corporation shall apply the provisions of regulation 25 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968, and the provisions of regulation 24 or regulation 26 of the said Regulations as may be appropriate.

(b) *Appointments*

1. The power to appoint persons to be officers or servants of the Corporation and to confirm such persons in their appointments.

2. In the exercise of the power delegated under paragraph 1 the Corporation shall apply the provisions of regulation 14 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968 and the provisions of regulation 12 or regulation 15 of the said Regulations as may be appropriate.

(c) *Transfers*

The power to transfer an officer or servant of the Corporation from an office in a grade to a similar office in the same grade with no alteration in his remuneration and this power shall be exercised subject to the provisions of regulation 29 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968, that require notice to be given to such officer or servant and whereby such officer or servant may make representations to the Commission.

(d) *Promotions*

1. The power to promote the officers and servants of the Corporation.

2. In the exercise of this power the Corporation shall apply the provisions of regulation 18 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968 and where appropriate, regulation 19 of the said Regulations.

(e) *Discipline*

1. The power to exercise disciplinary control in respect of any alleged act of misconduct prescribed in regulations 62, 64 and 81 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968 or indiscipline, to the extent that the Corporation may charge an officer or servant with any offence as aforesaid and may impose in respect of such misconduct or indiscipline any of the penalties specified in regulation 108 of the said Regulations.

2. In the exercise of the power delegated under paragraph 1, the Corporation shall exercise the powers of the Commission under paragraph (1) of regulation 86 and paragraphs (6) and (7) of regulation 88 of the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968 and shall appoint a disciplinary tribunal comprising one or more officers of a grade higher than that of the officer charged with misconduct or indiscipline to hear the evidence, find the facts and make a report thereon to the Corporation in accordance with the provisions respecting the functions and duties of a disciplinary tribunal as prescribed in the Statutory Authorities Service Commission Regulations, 1968.

The Corporation shall submit to the Commission once in every quarter a report on the exercise of any of the powers hereby delegated.

The powers hereby delegated are in respect of all the officers and servants of the Corporation.

The powers hereby delegated are subject to modification, variation or revocation at any time.
