AN ORDINANCE to amend the Stamp Duty Ordinance,
Cap. 206.

[5th May, 1931.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Stamp Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1931, and shall be read as one with the Stamp Duty Ordinance, Cap. 206, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. The words "one penny" shall be substituted for the word "twopence" in sub-section (1) of section 39 and in sub-section (2) of section 42 of the Principal Ordinance.

3. The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by inserting after the third exemption under "Letter or Power of Attorney, Mandate, or other

instrument in the nature thereof" a fourth exemption, as follows:—

- (4) Letter signed by a master, importer, exporter or ship's agent authorising some other person to sign any form required by the Customs laws and make declarations before the Collector of Customs and Excise on his behalf.
