THE LEGAL PROFESSION (ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION)
(NO. 3) ORDER, 1997

Citation 1. This Order may be cited as the Legal Profession (Eligibility for
Admission) (No. 3) Order, 1997.

Eligibility for admission to practise 2. The person referred to in Part I of the Schedule being a citizen of
the United Kingdom qualified to practise law in the United Kingdom for
not less than ten years, is eligible to be admitted to practise law in
Trinidad and Tobago subject to the terms and conditions specified in
Part II of the Schedule:

Mr. Vernon Pugh Q.C. Of the Honourable Society of Lincoln's Inn; Barrister-at-law; Admitted to practise at the Bar of the United Kingdom on the 25th day of November, 1969.

PART II

Mr. Vernon Pugh, Q.C., is eligible to be admitted to practise law as an Attorney only
in relation to the following cause namely, the matter of the request of the United
Kingdom for the extradition of George Arthur Stokes.
