THE WAGES COUNCILS ORDINANCE, CH. 22. No. 16

ORDER

MADE BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER SECTION 10 (4) OF THE
WAGES COUNCILS ORDINANCE

THE WAGES REGULATION (SPIRIT RETAILERS) ORDER, 1961

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Wages Regulation (Spirit Retailers) Order, 1961.

(2) This Order shall come into force on the 20th day of March, 1961.

2. In this Order—

“chief clerk” means a worker who is responsible for the cash and stock in spirit retailers premises and supervises the staff thereof, whether or not he personally sells or serves in the said premises;

“clerk” means a worker who sells and serves in spirit retailers premises and performs duties incidental thereto;

“spirit retailers premises” means any place in respect of which a spirit retailer’s licence has been issued under the Liquor Licences Ordinance, 1955;

“porter” means a worker who performs all or any of the following duties, namely: opening, closing, sweeping and cleaning any licensed premises; and lifting, carrying, opening, packing or unpacking goods in relation to the said premises.

3. The minimum remuneration payable to workers employed by the week in spirit retailers premises is as follows:—

(a) Chief Clerk	\$38.00 per week
(b) Clerk	26.00 ,,
(c) Porter	18.00 ,,

4. (1) Subject to sub-paragraph (2) of this paragraph, where a worker mentioned in paragraph 3 of this Order works for any period less than a week he shall be paid at a rate not less than the hourly minimum remuneration that would be applicable to such worker if he were employed by the week.

(2) Where a worker is employed for less than thirty-four hours in any week, he shall be paid at a rate not less than fifteen per centum more than the hourly minimum remuneration that would be applicable to such worker if he were employed by the week.

(3) The hourly minimum remuneration applicable to a worker is the amount obtained by dividing by forty-five the minimum remuneration that would be applicable to him if he were employed by the week.

5. (1) The workers referred to in paragraph 3 of this Order are entitled, after the expiration of each year of service after the commencement of this Order, to two consecutive weeks holiday with pay.

(2) The employer shall grant the holiday referred to in sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph within a period of four months after the date upon which the worker becomes entitled to such holiday, and the employer shall, during such holiday, pay to the worker wages at a rate not less than the minimum remuneration applicable to him immediately before the commencement of such holiday.
