AN ORDINANCE to provide for the qualification and control of Land Surveyors.

[By Proclamation.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Land Surveyors Short title. Ordinance, 1922.

2. No person shall practise or act as a Land Surveyor Surveyors to be licensed. until he has obtained a licence under this Ordinance.

3. The Governor may appoint a Board of Examiners Board of Examiners. consisting of such persons as he thinks fit, for the purpose of examining candidates desirous of being admitted to practise as Land Surveyors.

4. No person shall be licensed to practise as a Land Qualifications required for licence. Surveyor until he shall have attained the age of twenty-one years and unless he shall have satisfied the Board of

Examiners, either by passing an examination or otherwise, that he possesses the requisite qualifications to practise as a Land Surveyor.

Fee for and
form of
licence.

5.—(1) Any person who is reported by the Board of Examiners to be qualified as aforesaid, shall, on payment to the Receiver-General of the sum of £5 be entitled to receive from the Governor a licence to practise as a Land Surveyor.

(2) Such licence shall be in the form contained in the Schedule to this Ordinance.

Exemption of
certain
Government
officers and
surveyors.

6.—(1) Any person in the service of the Government who shall satisfy the Board of Examiners that he possesses the requisite qualifications to practise as a Land Surveyor shall be entitled to obtain a licence under this Ordinance without the payment of any fee.

(2) Any person who, before the commencement of this Ordinance, shall have been licensed as a Sworn Surveyor shall be entitled to obtain a licence under this Ordinance without undergoing any examination or the payment of any fee.

Power to
make rules.

7.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Governor in Executive Council to make rules for all or any of the following purposes, that is to say:—

- (a) For regulating the duration of articles and for the examination and licensing of persons desirous of practising as Land Surveyors ;
- (b) For regulating the manner and system in accordance with which surveys are to be performed, the construction of plans and the marks by which boundaries are to be defined ;
- (c) For declaring what shall be offences by Land Surveyors ;
- (d) For the cancellation of licences granted under this Ordinance.

(2) All rules made under this Ordinance shall be published in the *Royal Gazette* and shall be judicially noticed.

8.—(1) Every person who practises or acts as a Land Surveyor without being licensed under this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50. Offences.

(2) Every person who obstructs or causes to be obstructed any lawful survey of land, whether by force, or by threats, or in any other manner, shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding £50, and in the case of a continuing offence, to a penalty not exceeding £50 for each and every day on which he so obstructs or causes obstruction.

(3) Every person who contravenes any rule made under this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £50.

9. Penalties incurred under this Ordinance shall be recoverable on summary conviction before a magistrate; and the procedure in all such cases shall be according to the Summary Conviction Offences (Procedure) Ordinance, 1918. Recovery of penalties.

10. This Ordinance shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor by proclamation. Commencement.
