*Limes Export Levy.*

AN ORDINANCE to provide for the imposition of a levy on limes and lime products exported from the Colony for the purpose of furthering the interests of the limes industry.

[7th May, 1942.]

Commencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Limes Export Levy Ordinance, 1942. Short title.

2. The Governor in Council may by order impose a levy upon limes and lime products exported from the Colony at such rate or rates as he may deem expedient. Power to impose levy.

3. The provisions of the Customs Ordinance, shall have effect as though any levy imposed by virtue of this Ordinance was an export duty leviable by virtue of section 5 of that Ordinance. Application of the Customs Ordinance. Ch. 32. No. 2.

4. The Comptroller of Customs and Excise shall deposit all proceeds of any levy imposed by virtue of this Ordinance at the Treasury where they shall be credited by the Accountant General to a special account and the Accountant General shall pay therefrom such sums as the Governor in Council may from time to time direct towards the expenses of the West Indian Limes Association (Incorporated).
