STATUTORY DECLARATIONS ACT

An Act relating to Statutory Declarations.

[4TH APRIL 1908]

Commencement.

1. This Act may be cited as the Statutory Declarations Act. Short title.

2. Where a written law requires, authorises or permits any person to make a statutory declaration or where a person voluntarily desires to make a statutory declaration, the person designated for the purpose by the written law or any Judge, Magistrate, Justice of the Peace, Notary Public, Commissioner of Affidavits, or the Commissioner of State Lands or any other officer authorised to administer an oath, may take the declaration in the form set out in the Schedule. Power to take declarations. [45 of 1979].
Schedule.

3. (1) Subject to subsection (2), for every declaration referred to in section 2, there shall be paid in stamps by the person making the declaration the fee which is payable by means of stamps under the Commissioners of Affidavits Act, and the stamps shall be affixed to the declaration and cancelled by the person taking the declaration. Fee payable. [45 of 1979].

(2) Where a statutory declaration is taken by a Commissioner of Affidavits authorised by the President under section 5(3) of the Commissioners of Affidavits Act, the fee shall not be payable by means of stamps, but shall be retained by the Commissioner of Affidavits for his own use.

4. A declaration made under this Act may be referred to in any written law or other legal document as a statutory declaration. Mode of describing declaration.
