AN ORDINANCE to authorize the Government Geologist  
to enter upon private lands.

**B**E it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council  
thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Geological Survey Short Title.  
Ordinance 1905.

2. It shall be lawful for the Government Geologist and for  
any person assisting or employed by him and they are hereby Power to enter  
lands and set  
up marks.  
respectively authorized and empowered from time to time at  
all reasonable times in the daytime to enter in and upon the  
land of any owner or person whomsoever, and to break up the  
surface of any part of such land for the purpose of ascer-  
taining the rocks, strata or minerals within or under the  
same, and to take and carry away specimens of the rocks,  
strata or minerals found therein, and to fix any post, stone,  
mark or object on such land, and to dig up any ground for  
the purpose of fixing any such post, stone, mark or object.

Provided always that the Government Geologist and his assistants and employées shall not enter into or upon any enclosed yard, court or garden attached to a dwelling house without the previous consent of the owner or occupier thereof.

Obstructing

3. If any person shall resist or wilfully obstruct or hinder the said Geologist his assistants or employées or shall take away or displace or wilfully deface or destroy any stone, post, mark or object which shall be set up and placed as aforesaid, every such person shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance and on Summary Conviction thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds, and in default of payment shall be imprisoned with or without hard labour for any term not exceeding six months.

Interpretation.

4. In this Ordinance the term "Government Geologist" shall mean the Officer for the time being employed by the Government of this Colony as a Geological expert.
