AN ORDINANCE to amend the San Fernando and Arima Hucksters, Pedlars and Porters Ordinance, Cap. 233.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Trinidad and Tobago with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows :—

| Short title. | 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the San Fernando and Arima Hucksters, Pedlars and Porters (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, shall be construed as one with the San Fernando and Arima Hucksters, Pedlars and Porters Ordinance, Cap. 233, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1935. |

| Amendment of section 4 of Principal Ordinance Addition of new sub-section as sub-section 2. | 2. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by renumbering sub-section (2) thereof as sub-section (3) and by the addition of the following sub-section as sub-section (2) :— |
| Power to take unlicensed Pedlar and his goods before Magistrate, &c. | (2) It shall be lawful for any member of the Constabulary Force to demand from any person travelling as or carrying on the trade of a Pedlar the production of his licence, and unless such person shall on such demand produce a licence still in force, |

it shall be lawful for the person demanding the same to take the Pedlar with his goods to the nearest Magistrate who shall have jurisdiction to try the offender for carrying on the trade of a Pedlar without the licence required by law, although no act of trading may prove to have been done within the district of such Magistrate.

3. Section 13 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by renumbering the same as Section 13 (1) and by the addition of the following sub-section as sub-section (2) : Amendment of section 13 of Principal Ordinance.

(2) No Pedlar or Huckster shall carry on his business on Sundays or any Public Holiday. Additional sub-section to section 13.

4. The first schedule of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by substituting for the list of articles contained therein the following :—Fresh fish, milk, fruit, vegetables, ground provisions, meat, game, poultry, eggs, bread, confectionery, ice cream, mineral waters or any goods, wares or merchandise the growth or produce of or manufactured from the produce of the Colony, or any books, pamphlets or other literature issued or published by any religious or educational organization approved by the Governor. Amendment to schedule 1 of articles which may be sold without licence.

5. The second schedule of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended in respect of fees payable in the Borough of San Fernando and the Borough of Arima by the addition thereto of the following :— Amendment to schedule of charges in the Boroughs of San Fernando and Arima.

IN THE BOROUGH OF SAN FERNANDO AND THE BOROUGH OF ARIMA.

The following additional charges shall be made where the Pedlar or Huckster employs or uses for transport of his goods :— Additional charges.

(a) a porter or a pack animal 15/-
(b) a vehicle other than a motor vehicle 25/-
(c) a motor vehicle 50/-

Repeal and re-enactment of section 17 of Principal Ordinance.

Power to add to or vary list of articles, licences and fares in schedules.

6. Section 17 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and in lieu thereof shall be read the following:—

17. (1) The Mayor and Burgesses may by resolution add to or vary the list of articles in the first schedule, alter or add to the fees payable for licences in the second schedule and alter the table of fares in the third schedule of this Ordinance.

Provided that no such resolution shall take effect until it has been approved by the Governor in Executive Council and published in the *Royal Gazette*.

(2) Production of a copy of the *Royal Gazette* purporting to contain a resolution of the Mayor and Burgesses adding to or varying the said list of articles, altering or adding to the fees payable for such licences, and altering the said table and stating that such resolution has been approved by the Governor in Executive Council shall be sufficient evidence that such resolution was duly passed and approved as required by this Ordinance, and of the terms and date thereof.
