It originally consisted of “The Special Adviser (Protective Services) (Pension Rights) Act (No. 2 of 1977)”. However, other similar Acts creating special pensions rights have now been incorporated in this Chapter.

Commencement.

**1.** This Act may be cited as the Pension Rights (Special Provisions) Act. Short title.

**2.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, it is hereby declared that the person holding the office of Special Adviser (Protective Services) in the Ministry of National Security shall continue to enjoy pension rights similar to those he enjoyed as the holder of an office in the Police Service. Special Adviser (Protective Services) to National Security Ministry. [2 of 1977].

**3.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, it is hereby declared that the person holding the office of Special Adviser to the Cabinet on all Protective Services and Chief Executive Officer of the National Security Council shall continue to enjoy pension rights similar to those enjoyed by him as the holder of an office in the Police Service. Special Adviser (Protective Services) to Cabinet. [23 of 1979].

**4.** Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, it is hereby declared that the person holding the office of Inspector of Fire Services in the Ministry of National Security shall continue to enjoy pension rights similar to those he enjoyed as the holder of an office in the Fire Service. Inspector of Fire Services (National Security Ministry). [47 of 1979].
